

## Rules for submitting articles – Section Science and Technology

### Editorial line

*Ciencia en Revolución* journal will consider for its diffusion original and unpublished works in the scientific – technological scope.

All manuscripts that are received for publication will be subject to arbitration by experts in the area, through the double blind system. The author must accept this arbitration.

*Ciencia en Revolución* digital journal is open access, it does not charge for its dissemination, it is maintained by collaboration of members of the scientific community

### Type of Manuscripts

Ciencia en Revolución will accept the following works for publication

1. Articles of technological trend, prospective studies of medium and long term R+D+i of high utility in the industrial field with a maximum of eighteen (18) pages.
2. Unpublished research articles with a maximum of twenty (20) pages.
3. Technical notes with a maximum of five (5) pages.
4. Articles of scientific update that summarize the State of the Art of a specific area referring to what to do scientific - technological with a maximum of twelve (18) pages.
5. Article special invited with a maximum of twenty (20) pages.
6. Articles of scientific disclosure.
7. Letters to the editor.

### Commitment

Submitting an article to Ciencia en Revolución, the work author is committed to formal so that the paper is original and unpublished, he shows his knowledge of Ciencia en Revolución standards and that his work will be refereed. The author must sign a commitment letter upon receipt.

### Article Style

Articles may be sent either in Spanish or English. The original work should be written using L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X, or in WORD, or in Libre Office Writer. The Office works must employ a font of family Time, to be stored in compact disk and to present three copies in physical. The works will be accepted through the e-mail of the journal.

The labored in L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X must include the files pdf, tex and a folder with the figure in eps (or png).

### Figures

Figures must be preferable in pdf, eps or png format (also admit jpg format, if these are of high quality) must be added in records separated and numbered. Figures caption or descriptions can not be into these, must be includes in the text of the work and in a file apart called Figure Caption.

Legends or descriptions of the figures can not be embedded in them, they must be included in the text of the work and in a separate file called Legend of Figures. Should be cited and sufficiently discussed in the text, the quote would be in the form: “in Figure 3” without abbreviating the word figure. These must be numbered in Arabic (1,2, ...) consecutive throughout the work.

### Tables

Tables can not be protruded by any type of color. Only the texts to be produced by means of “bold type”. Also must to be included in others files numerated and it is necessary to include a file with table caption.

All tables must be numbered in Arabic (1, 2, ...), cited and sufficiently commented in the text from work. The quote would be in the form: “in Table 2”, for example (without abbreviating). All board or figure must have a wide maximum of 17,5cm.

## Writing order

The order to follow for the writing of the work is the following:

1. Title Page,
2. Introduction,
3. Methodology or Research Development,
4. Analysis and Discussion of Results, and References
5. Conclusions,
6. References.

**Title page** should contain:

- Title of the work in Spanish and English, maximum 20 words.
- Full name(s) of author(s) with Full Institutional Address(es) (Address, Telephone, Email).
- Summary of the work in Spanish and in English (Abstract) with a maximum of 200 words for Unpublished, State of the Art articles and Technical Notes.
- At the end of the Summary in Spanish and Abstract in English three to five (3 to 5) Key Words should be added.

The headings of each section are written title type, capitals only in the first letter.

Text references must contain the name of the main author followed by the corresponding number of reference; for example: Jhonson [9], or simply [9] with no author name.

References will be written in order of citation, complete and should contain: author(s) (in caps and lower case), full title, journal, volume, number, pages and year of publication. For example: G.O. Beale, F.J. Arteaga, and W.M. Black, Design and Evaluation of a Controller for the Process of Microwave Joining of Ceramics. *IEEE Transactions of Industrial Electronics*. 39(4), 301–312, 1992.

In the case of Books: Author(s) (in caps and lower case), *title*, publisher, place and year of publication should be included. For example: J.M. Hill and J.N. Dewynne, Heat Conduction. *Blackell Set. Pub.*, London, 1987.

Work in an edited collection: Author(s) (in caps and lower case), *title*. In: editor, *title*, volume,

publisher, place and year. For example: S.L. Kalla and L. Galué, Generalized fractional, in *Calculus*. Global Publishing Company, USA, 145-178, 1997.

The following types of works can be cited:

1. Articles of scientific journals.
2. Articles of conference proceedings.
3. Articles in collections.
4. Books.
5. Chapters in a book.
6. Memories of congresses.
7. Doctoral theses.
8. Masther theses.
9. Special grade works.
10. Technical reports.
11. Technical manuals.
12. Patents.
13. Norms and laws.

**It is not allowed to quote electronic addresses or web pages.**

It is recommended to the authors to follow the International Nomenclature Norms (symbols, units and abbreviations).

## Final Notes

Articles will be submitted for the reviewing process before they can be published.

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
